## COMMERCE COMMISSION DECREE 2010 (Decree No. 49 of 2010)

## Commerce (Control of Prices for Postal Services) Order 2012

PURSUANT to section 39 of the Commerce Commission Decree 2010, and after considering a recommendation from the Fiji Commerce Commission and after being satisfied that this declaration is necessary in the interest of consumers and users for the prices of Postal Services to be controlled in accordance with this Decree and that these services will be supplied in a market in which competition is limited, I hereby make this Order -

Short title and commencement

- 1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Commerce (Control of Prices for Postal Services) Order 2012, and shall come into force on 13<sup>th</sup> September, 2012.
  - (2) The Commerce Commission Decree 2010 shall be referred to as the "Decree".

## Interpretation

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires -

"postal service" means -

- (a) the conveyance of postal articles through a postal system from one place to another within Fiji, whether by land, sea or air;
- (b) performing incidental services in the course of transmission by post by accepting, receiving, collecting and delivering postal articles; or
- (c) the provision and maintenance of letter boxes for delivery and collection of postal articles;
- "postal article" has the same meaning under section 78 (1) of the Posts and Telecommunications Decree 1989; and
- "postal system" has the same meaning under section 78 (1) of the Posts and Telecommunications Decree 1989.

Control of Prices for Supply of Postal Services 3. For the purpose of section 39 of the Decree, the prices for the supply of postal services in all quantities, qualities, grades and classes in Fiji are controlled.
